 - E-25-003, issued 3/12/25, Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges 2025 Edition
 - E-25-004, issued 4/17/25, Guidance for MassDOT Ancillary Structures Program


FY 2024 In Review (10/1/23--9/30/24)

- Notable project completions include:

 - Weymouth: Reconstruction of Route 18
 - Bedford/Billerica: Reconstruction of Middlesex Turnpike
 - Greenfield: Bridge Replacement, 191 over BMRR
- Began construction on major projects, including:







Upcoming Major Projects

612004 Everett-Somerville: Mystic River Bicycle and Pedestrian Crossing

Schedule Advertisement: 3/07/2026

Office Estimate: \$65M

- Initiated by DCR to construct a new Bicycle/Pedestrian Bridge over Mystic River to complete 11.5 mile long Northern Strand Project
- Connects five Northern Strand communities to rapid transit, to Mystic River north-south trail network, and ultimately to downtown Boston
- Pedestrian accommodations with a shared use path, and roadway tie-in to approach developments







612187 Chicopee: I-391 over Route 116 (Chicopee Street)

- Scheduled Advertising 4/25/2026
- Office Estimate \$143,000,000
- Full replacement of existing 7-span structure carrying I-391 over Route 116 (Chicopee St) with 4-span bridge
- Roadway construction to include Mill and Overlay, Full Depth Pavement, median barrier replacement and other incidental work







Upcoming Major Projects

607349 Norwell - Pembroke: Route 3 NB/SB over the North River

• Schedule Advertisement: 5/23/2026

Office Estimate: \$43M

- Replacement of twin structurally deficient 3-span Route 3 bridges over the North River.
- Southbound Bridge to be constructed in the existing median utilizing a temporary cross over. Southbound roadway is realigned in the final condition.
- Wetland permitting and replication will be necessary.








612006 Duxbury: Powder Point Avenue Bridge over Duxbury Bay

Scheduled Advertising: 3/20/2027

• Office Estimate: \$150,000,000

- Replacement of existing 2,200 ft. long
 110 span timber structure due to
 substructure deterioration
- Roadway construction to tie into existing conditions at the approaches to the new bridge.







612494 Springfield-West Springfield: Route 20 (Park Avenue) over Connecticut River

- Scheduled Advertising: 4/17/2027
- Office Estimate: \$200M
- Full replacement of existing 1100' long
 7-span bridge carrying Route 20 over
 the Connecticut River
- Reconfiguration of the adjacent intersection and rotary
- Will incorporate sidewalks, shared use paths, and overlooks to the river







612167 & 612495 Springfield: St. James Avenue & Tapley Street over I-291 & CSX RR

- Scheduled Advertising: 8/28/2027
- Office Estimate: \$150M
- Replacement of the existing structurally deficient four span bridge carrying Tapley Street over I-291 and CSX RR
- Replacement of the existing structurally deficient five span bridge carrying St.
 James Avenue over I-291 and CSX RR
- Replacing and reconfiguring ramps associated with St. James Ave/I-291 interchange and associated roadway improvements
- Replacing St. James Ave/Page Blvd signalized intersection with roundabout and associated roadway improvements








608396 Lynn-Revere: Route 1A over Saugus River

- Scheduled Advertising: 2/5/2028
- Office Estimate: \$175,000,000
- Replacement of the structurally deficient movable bridge with a new 1,300' long fixed span bridge to the east of the existing structure
- Provides a 33'-8" high by 140'-0"
 wide navigational channel,
 improved pedestrian
 accommodations with a new
 shared use path, and roadway tiein to approach developments



Municipal Grant Opportunities



Complete Streets Funding Program

Details: A three-tiered program encouraging the incorporation of Complete Streets principles in local planning and design practice.

Communities who participate in this program pass a local policy, adopt a prioritization plan, and implement multimodal projects.

Focus: Sidewalks, bike lanes, shared-use paths, bus stop Improvements.

Municipal Pavement Program

Details: A program focused on improving the condition of municipally owned state numbered routes. Not a competitive grant program. Projects are selected based on pavement condition data, the proportion of state numbered routes in poor condition in a municipality, and geographic equity.

Focus: Pavement rehabilitation, resurfacing, or pavement preservation.

Chapter 90 Program

Details: A formula-based program that provides funding to all communities each fiscal year for improvements to transportation infrastructure. Not a competitive application program.

Focus: Roadway construction, pedestrian/bicycle infrastructure, road building equipment, consultant services.

Municipal Small Bridge Program

Details: A program providing funding to municipalities for the improvement of bridges that are on a local public way, included in the State Bridge inventory, and have a span between 10 and 20 feet.

Focus: Bridge replacement, preservation, or rehabilitation.

Local Bottleneck Reduction Program

Details: A program that funds innovative solutions to address congestion bottlenecks on local roadways to improve traffic flow. Selection is based off of bottleneck related congestion and delay metrics.

Focus: Improvements to traffic signal timing, equipment, vehicle detection, and infrastructure.

Shared Streets and Spaces Program

Details: A program focusing on improvements to plazas, sidewalks, curbs, streets, bus stops, parking areas, and other other public spaces in support of public health, safe mobility, and strengthened commerce.

Focus: Sidewalks, crosswalks, bike lanes, dedicated bus or bus/bike lanes, wayfinding, lighting.

Updates



- Last application round closed in February.
 We expect Shared Streets and Spaces to be announced in May.
- Complete Streets FY26 Round 1 is open through May 1.
- FY25 Municipal Pavement Program segments are underway, FY26 scoping sessions expected to start in May.

Updates (Continued)



- FY25 Local Bottleneck Reduction Program is beginning site visits and kickoff meetings.
 Next round expected late Fall 2025.
- Complete Streets FY26 Round 2 will begin accepting applications at the start of September.
- The latest Municipal Small Bridge Program awards are expected to be announced in May.

Updates (Continued)



- FY26 Chapter 90 letters were sent to communities at the end of February. Will be notified when the filing is voted with your confirmed apportionment.
 - Expected to be funded at \$300M
 - \$200M distributed through traditional Chapter 90 formula
 - \$100M distributed through road miles only formula
 - Expected to be a Multi-Year Authorization for 5 years to allow for planning and predictability.
- FY25 Fair Share Funds have been added to your Chapter 90 accounts. Please reach out to Kristen Rebelo or your district State aid office for your allocation amount.
